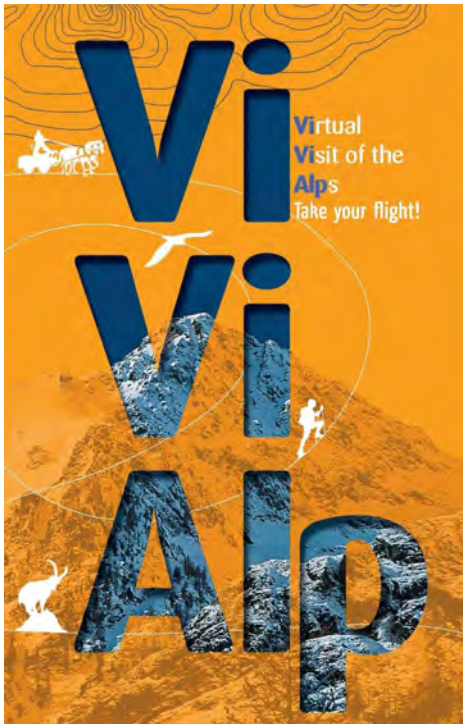


## MOBILE STATION « ViViAlp »



### Discover the Alps like you have never seen them before!

The virtual visit of the alpine protected areas (ViViAlp) is a playful and pedagogical discovery tool, which has been developed by the protected areas of the ALPARC network in the context of a European project.

This special device allows to take a 3D-flight over the Alps and to see the differences and similarities between different protected areas from a bird's eye view, aiming at the creation of a better understanding of the real reach of this fascinating massif. There are two possibilities of exploration, either the free flight by means of a joystick, or the simple use of the touch screen.

### The virtual visit of the Alps


From France to Slovenia, discover the territories of certain protected areas: Information about fauna, flora, nature protection, landscapes, populations and cultural heritage can be consulted by the visitor. Information is composed by a short explanation text and an illustration (photograph, drawing, video stream). Actually, this information covers more than 750 points of interest.



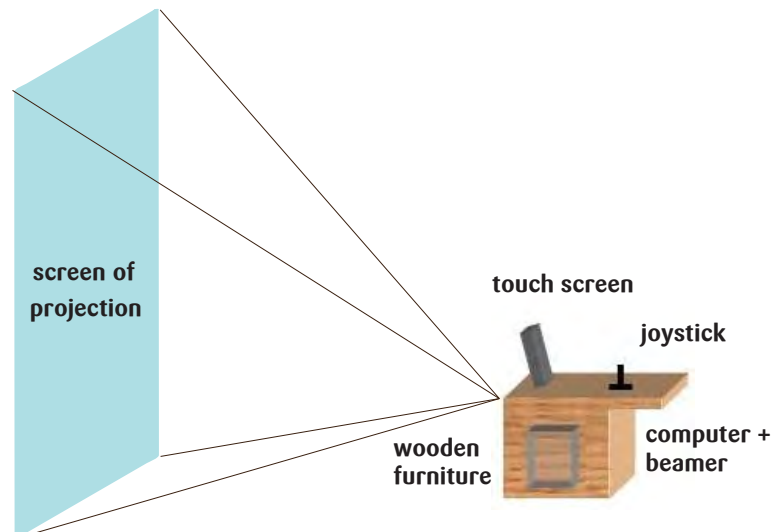
The virtual visit is available in 5 languages: German, French, Italian, Slovenian and English.

Several alpine protected areas have already equipped their visitor centres with a permanent station of ViViAlp, which is encountering a big interest from visitors.

The Task Force Protected Areas has currently the possibility to **provide a mobile station of ViViAlp.**
