







Wildlife and winter sport activities "Your space of freedom - my living space."

March 3 and 4 2016 Massif des Bauges Regional Nature Park Lescheraines - Congress Center "Eau Vive"

Winter sport and recreational activities have become ever more popular over the last decade. These bring more and more people to protected areas and their sensitive natural zones. Especially in the winter season, increased frequentation and the multiplication of activities conflict with the life of the alpine fauna. Alpine protected areas and other stakeholders have acquired knowledge about these conflicts and have developed manifold management methods to address them, e.g. monitoring tools, guidance measures and awareness-raising campaigns. It is time to exchange and capitalize on these experiences on an Alpine-wide level in order to increase efficiency at all levels.

The workshop "Wildlife and winter sport activities" aims at contributing to the exchange of experiences between Alpine protected areas and other stakeholders. The workshop lays a special focus on the activities ski touring, snowshoeing and free riding. Speakers from protected areas, research, regional authorities and Alpine clubs will present up-to-date knowledge on conflicts as well as tools and practices for a better management. Participants will be able to discuss about experiences from their own practice. The workshop shall come up with key elements for a common vision on the management of winter sport activities in Alpine protected areas and beyond.
