Slovenia




- since 1890, brown bear has been protected on large forest estates in the south-western part of Slovenia
- > in 1940 the size of population was estimated at around 80
- > since 1945 brown bear has been protected by the Hunting Act
- **/**,
- > in 2004 new Hunting Act was issued: brown bear is no longer game species!

for the last 100 year bear has always been safeguarded

-> never been extinct









Austria



- > 18th century: extermination of bear in the Austrian Alps
- > 1971/72 : natural immigration of a brown bear ("Ötscher") from Slovenia
- 1989-1993: reintroduction project promoted by WWF Austria (10-15 releases planned; realized: 3)
- > 1994: damages increase, public acceptance decreases and two bears are shot. Further releases are stopped
- > 1991-2006: 31 cubs were born; they all disappeared


since 2002: constantly negative trend







- > 1970ies: signs of presence of bears in Friuli Venezia Giulia
- 2000: maximum bear range: some individuals (2?) reach Veneto and Eastern Trentino
- > 2000-2004: reduction in bear range
- 2004-2007: 4-7 bears Val Torre, Val Natisone, Prealpi Giulie; 2-4 bears in Alpi Giulie and Eastern Alpi Carniche; 1-2 bears in Western Alpi Carniche and Prealpi Carniche)







Trentino



- > 1950ies: only brown bear population of Italian Alps
- > 1988: institution of Adamello
 Brenta Nature Park also for the protection of bear habitat
- 1996: promotion of Life Ursus project by Adamello Brenta Nature Park
- > 1997: only 3-4 autochthonous bear left in Eastern Brenta mountains






Actual distribution of brown bear on the Alps







Brown bear metapopulation on the Alps








